#### **Charity Disaster Fraud and Scams!**

When crisis strikes, criminals seem to be among the first to respond and take advantage of others' suffering with fake charities and other schemes.

They may pose as contractors and FEMA officials after natural disasters such as those dealing with the California wildfires for example. These types of occurrences can bring out the best in people, as well as the scammers in hopes to make a quick buck.

According to the National Centers for Environmental Information, in 2023, disasters in the U.S. caused \$95 billion in losses. The National Insurance Crime Bureau (NICB), a nonprofit organization which works to prevent and combat insurance fraud, estimates 10% of those losses (\$9.3 billion), was lost to post disaster fraud.

However, fraud comes in many forms from Fake Contractors, Government, Utility and insurance impostors and Bogus Charities.


Phony charities will get busy making calls, sending text messages, emails and social media posts soliciting donations for relief work. Scammers set up domains featuring the fire's location or the storm's name and use words like "help" and "relief". Other faux fundraisers imply a connection to a well-known aid organization like the Red Cross.

How to Recognize a charity disaster scam

When a disaster charity's name or website address resembles but does not quite match that of an established aid organization, and its website offers few details about it. (lack of physical location or history of relief work)

Check the Charity and only give to charities with a proven track record of disaster work. Use online resources like Charity Navigator, CharityWatch, GuideStar or the BBB's Wise Giving Alliance to check an organization. Research the sender before hitting the donate button.

If you are solicited by phone, HANG UP and go to CharityNavigator.org and get the information on where to contact the real charity.






